Dial Phone System Set For Oakland

Installation of an automatic dial telephone exchange for Oakland, to take the place of the present manual office, is now being planned, according to F. L. Crittenden, manager for the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company.

The new dial exchange, it is expected, will be placed in operation this fall. The type of central office to be placed in Oakland is known as a community dial exchange, and is recognized as the most modern and up-to-date equipment available for a city of the size and location of Oakland.

All the calls will be dialed. Long distance, information and other miscellaneous calls will be handled by direct circuits to Roseburg; such calls will be made by dialing "Operator."

In line with the company's policy, opportunities for employment elsewhere will be offered all regular Oakland operators.

All Oakland telephone customers are to be individually notified of the change, and the company late this summer will begin installing

dial telephones to replace the present magneto telephones. A special feature of the new dial system for Oakland is that all of the rural or farmer line telephones also will be dial-operated.

Total cost of the dial project for Oakland will be in the neighborhood of \$13,000.

Half of Bonneville 'Juice' Retained for Public Use

WASHINGTON, March 7.—(AP)—Legislation reserving to public use half of the energy generated at the Bonneville project became a law today.

President Roosevelt signed the Power McNary bill providing half the power supply must be reserved for publicly owned distribution systems, making the project a unit of the interior department and authorizing the employment of an assistant administrator, a chief engineer and general counsel at \$7,500 a year each.

France Liberalizes Laws to Facilitate Widows Pension

PARIS, March 7.—(AP)—French women now may marry soldiers or sailors in absentia and even after the death of the intended husband.

It is designed to legitimize children and facilitate widows' pensions.
