For that matter, they asked, "what is the Queen Elizabeth, anyway? It is not even finished. In fact, it is a skeleton. Now, the Bremen—that was something!" (They referred to the German liner Bremen's dash last fall from New York to Marseilles, Russia, and subsequent run home through the British blockade.)

what proved to be a successful chase.

War Progress Reviewed. Air Ministry Chief Sir Kingsley Wood told the house of commons today the royal air force had carried out more than a thousand sorties into German territory by day and night since the outbreak of war. He spoke in presenting secret air force estimates which he said involved "the greatest expenditure of this kind in Great Britain's history."

In surveying the air war to date he said 14 German aircraft had been brought down around British coasts "without a single loss on our side" and many more had been forced down in neutral territory or upon the sea.

Great Expansion Planned. In asking for funds for developing the R.A.F., Sir Kingsley said the air force was preparing for a "great expansion of strength which we know will be required."

Where last year the total strength of the air force approached 100,000 men, that is the strength today of one command alone of a force which is divided into coastal, fighter and British expeditionary force commands.

Wood said that British fighters had sighted German submarines on more than 100 occasions and had delivered more than 60 attacks and successfully escorted more than 700 convoys.

Germany is expanding and improving her air force, Sir Kingsley said, but "many of her aircraft types must have proved disappointing." In a survey of the first six

months of the war Campinchi asserted that "the allied naval supremacy is better than ever and Germany's main fleet does not move much nor far from its bases."

Sternwheeler Ends Long Columbia River Career

PORTLAND, March 7.—(AP)—The steamer Lewiston was berthed here today ending a colorful 80-year navigation era on the Snake and upper Columbia rivers. The sternwheeler, probably the last of its type to navigate the hazardous waters of the rivers, docked last night after a voyage from Lewiston, Idaho.

She will be renamed the Barry K. for towboat service on the Willamette and Columbia rivers. A steamer loaded with men and supplies bound for cold in Idaho hills conquered the rivers for the first time in 1861.

Jap Parliament Will Oust Opponent of War

TOKYO, March 7.—(AP)—Expulsion of Takao Saito from parliament for a speech considered to reflect on the Japanese army's aims in China was decided yesterday by the disciplinary committee of the lower house.

The decision followed a month of political bickering in which Saito, a prominent politician, refused to retract his speech and demanded that the full text be published. The diet (parliament) was thrown into an uproar Feb. 2, when Saito suggested withdrawal of troops from China.

Planes Strafe Russians

The Finnish air force was particularly active in punishing shell-less Russians on the stretches of ice, the high command saying: "Our aircraft carried out reconnaissance flights and bombed and machine-gunned enemy units and columns observed on the ice of Viipuri bay and the Gulf of Finland."

Russians meanwhile were active in adjacent areas and in northern Finland. One Russian bomber was shot down during the day, the army announced.

Finnish sources denied reports abroad that Baron Field Mannerheim, Finland's commander-in-chief, was ill.

SWEDEN TRYING TO BRING RUSSO-FINISH PEACE

STOCKHOLM, March 7.—(AP)—Sweden is seeking to arrange an armistice in the Russo-Finnish war, usually reliable sources said today, adding that Russian peace terms recently had been presented to Finland.

The exact nature of the terms is still the subject of speculation, but there were unconfirmed reports that Russia demanded surrender of the Karelian isthmus, Viipuri, Lake Ladoga and part of the far northern Petsamo area.
