ROAST LEG OF LAMB RECIPE:
Thoroughly wash two or three cloves of garlic, depending on how well you like it, melt large chunk of butter and add to the garlic. Add one cup of flour, gradually mixing in enough water to make a thick paste. Spread this paste completely over the lamb, which has previously been salted and peppered. Bake in oven 300 degrees F. in uncovered roasting pan, allowing 30 minutes to every pound. After it has browned nicely in the last 20 minutes, take from oven and remove crust and skin from the outside before serving.
