NOTICE TO WATER USERS OF ROBERTS CREEK AND ITS TRIBUTARIES, INCLUDING COOPER SPRING, IN DOUGLAS COUNTY, OREGON

To all persons, firms and corporations claiming a right to the use of the waters of, or owning or being in possession of lands bordering on or having access to Roberts Creek and its tributaries, including Cooper Spring, in Douglas County, Oregon:

And to all whom it may concern: You and each of you are hereby notified that the State Engineer will re-examine the taking of statements and proof of claim of all parties claiming rights to the use of waters of the above-named stream or any of its tributaries as follows:

On Tuesday, April 20, 1940, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at Roseburg, Oregon. And for a period of 10 days, beginning with Wednesday, May 1, and ending with Friday, May 10, 1940; at the office of the State Engineer in the State Office Building, Salem, Oregon.

Statements and proofs of claim of the various claimants will be received at said time and place from 8:30 A. M. to 12 M. and from 1:00 P. M. to 5:00 P. M. of each of said days, excepting Saturday afternoons and Sundays.

And you are hereby required to appear at one of the times and places above-named and submit proof of your claim to the use of waters of said stream or a tributary thereof, if any such right is claimed by you; and you are hereby further notified that if you fail to so appear and submit proof of your claim in said waters, default will be entered against you and you will be barred and estopped from subsequently asserting any right to the use of said waters, and will be deemed to have forfeited all right to the use of said waters heretofore claimed by you.
