Alien Export Smuggling Ring on West Coast Eyed

LOS ANGELES, April 5.—(AP)—The Times said yesterday that Federal authorities are investigating an alien export smuggling ring extending from Canada to California and Florida.

The inquiry is centered, the newspaper stated, at Los Angeles, San Francisco and Seattle harbors, where a number of aliens recently were reported shipped to the Orient, using purportedly forged passports.

Saying the investigation is being conducted directly by FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, the Times reported that a number of aliens figuring in the inquiry are believed to have escaped from Canadian concentration camps and were smuggled into this country.

Boat Accident Drowns Grand Coulee Workers

GRAND COULEE, Wash., April 5.—(AP)—A WPA clearing crew at Camp Ferry No. 2, eight miles up the Columbia river from Grand Coulee dam, searched the stream's waters today for the body of James Thompson, about 55, of Tacoma, one of two workers who died yesterday when an outboard motorboat sank in midstream.

The other was Glen Donovan, about 50, of Seattle. His body was brought to shore by the six survivors of the tragedy.

Ray Shale, 46, Starbuck; C. Heller, 49, Tacoma; C. E. Oglin, 38, Wapato; S. J. Esalan, 49, Spokane, and John Hill, 39, and Ray W. Luth, 58, Seattle, escaped death. The survivors, brought to the hospital here, said the boat suddenly filled and sank. Each man grasped a life preserver and Donovan paddled at some distance from the others, who towed the boat toward shore, before he weakened.

Former Azalea Resident Dies at Sacramento

AZALEA, April 5.—Word has been received here of the death of Mrs. Janet Ross, a former resident of here, who died Tuesday morning at Sacramento, Calif., following a long illness.

Surviving are her parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. H. Clare, a sister, Mrs. Ralph Stark, and three brothers, Leon Clare, Dan Clare and Jimmy Clare, all of Sacramento.

Funeral services were held at Sacramento Thursday afternoon.
