Mrs. Eva Golder left Saturday for Oakland, Calif., where she will visit her daughter for a month.

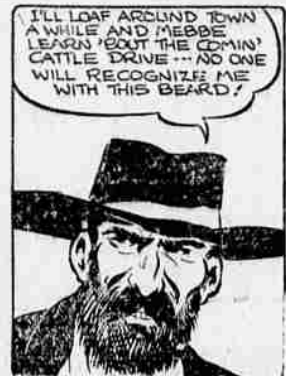
