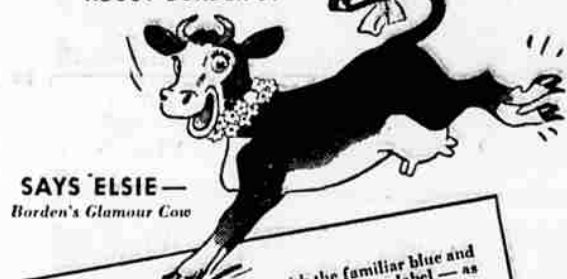

San Francisco took the lead in
the first frame and was never
headed. The Ducks came to life
in the last three innings to chalk
up seven runs, but the damage al-
ready had been done.

Three Batters Mauled.
Largely because three of its bat-
ters were struck by pitched balls,
all in the same inning, Oakland
defeated Sacramento 9 to 3 and
managed to hold its half-game
league lead.

In the eighth inning of last
night's contest at Oakland, the
three batters were hit, enabling
the home team to collect seven
runs on three bingles.

In second place and put-
ting hard for the circuit leadership,
San Diego defeated Hollywood 9 to 8.
The San Diego Padres tied the
score at 5 apiece in the eighth,
then gathered four more unearned
runs before the inning ended. Hol-
lywood rallied in the ninth with three
runs. The tying and winning runs
were on base when the team was
retired.
