W. M. Porter Rites Occur at Eugene

Funeral services were held at the Veatch chapel in Eugene Saturday for William M. Porter, 75, who died at his farm in Camas Valley Tuesday.

Mr. Porter was born in Vandalia, Mo., May 7, 1865, and received his early education in the town of his birth, later being graduated from Worcester university in Ohio. He was married in 1888 to Jennie F. Smith at Wooster, Ohio.

Mr. Porter served as county school superintendent in North Platte, Neb., before coming to Oregon in 1898 and locating at Roseburg. He taught school for a number of years at South Deer creek and Camas Valley. He took an active part in church work and was a great lover of music.

The family moved to Eugene in 1907. In 1912 he ran for state senator on the prohibition ticket. He was a member of the Modern Woodmen lodge and the Presbyterian church, having his membership with the church at Camas Valley, which he assisted in organizing.

Surviving are his widow, Jennie Porter; a son, Fred Porter, Albert, Can., and four daughters, Mrs. Elizabeth Dobell, Salem; Mrs. Ruth Lane, Aberdeen, Wash.; Mrs. Helen McCann, Longview, Wash.; Mrs. Made Bowen, Hoquiam, Wash.

Burial was in the L.O.O.F. cemetery No. 1 at Eugene.

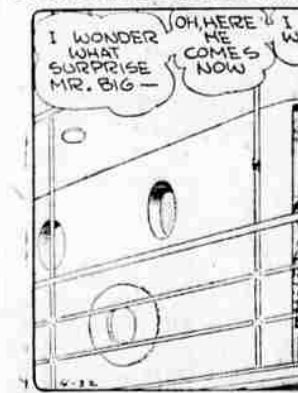
