DOUGLAS COUNTY ADAPTED TO SUGAR BEET RAISING

YONCALLA, Ore., May 6.—Editor News-Review—The other day as I was opening up a sack of sugar, I just happened to glance at the letters on the sack and was sure pleased to see: "Made in Oregon."

I had known that Nysa, Ore., was producing sugar, but had not noticed before that I had been using any Oregon sugar.

It certainly is as nice a grade of sugar as I have ever used—not coarse like some granulated sugar I used to get, but nice and fine enough for first class cake frosting.

At the risk of seeming to try to smuggle into your paper an advertisement of said sugar, I want to tell your readers that Douglas county can raise as fine sugar beets as can be produced anywhere.

Many years ago, when our faithful congressman, Binger Hermann, was in Washington, he sent my husband enough sugar beet seed to plant quite a good sized place in the garden with the request we let him know what success we had in sugar beet culture.

We had a wonderful little crop of beets, and so informed Mr. Hermann. Of course, as we had no way to make sugar, we used the beets to good advantage for feeding stock.

I have no doubt that Mr. Hermann sent samples of sugar beet seed to several residents of this county.

Even though we cannot embark in the making of sugar here in Douglas county as yet, I know that the housewives will not find any better sugar than "made in Oregon."

Sprague Urges Federal Aid to Fight Beetles

SALEM, May 7.—(AP)—Gov. Charles A. Sprague telegraphed a protest to Oregon's congressional delegation yesterday that the state would be unable to control Mormon crickets and grasshoppers unless congress approves a \$600,000 appropriation for control of white-fringed beetles.

The governor said that if the appropriation is rejected, funds to fight the beetles would have to come from the U. S. department of agriculture's emergency fund to fight all pests. Thus, the governor wrote, there would be insufficient money left to control Mormon crickets, grasshoppers and other pests.

President Roosevelt recommended the \$600,000 appropriation, the house eliminated it, and the senate approved it. A conference committee so far has been unable to agree.

Methodists Ask Moral Embargo on War Goods
