

American Mother Of 1940 Speaks

Mrs. Mayo Offers No Formula for Bringing up Children; Prefers Baby to Auto.

ROCHESTER, Minn.—(AP)—If she had to choose between a baby or a new car, Mrs. Charles H. Mayo, the American mother for 1940, would take the baby—even if she had to use a wheelbarrow to get around.

Emphasizing that children are worth great sacrifices, Mrs. Mayo, who is 49 years old, said in an interview:

"If it were a question of having a baby or a new car, I would advise a young couple to have the baby. I'd take the baby first every time and go in a wheelbarrow."

Mrs. Mayo, who reared eight children of her own and an adopted daughter and foster son, said she has no formula for being a successful mother.

"I just brought up the children the best I knew how," she said. "The silver-haired widow of the world-renowned surgeon was named by the Golden Rule foundation as the 1940 American mother."

Mrs. Mayo's two reactions were:

(1) "Why, I've never done anything!"

(2) "I can think of 100 women right off who deserve it more than I do."

Part of City's Life.

From the day in the 1880's when she chose a nurse's career in defiance of the stay-at-home customs of the day, she has been an integral part of Rochester's life, making it a home for thousands of patients, and young surgeons and nurses.

Born Edith Graham, daughter of a pioneer Minnesota farmer, Mrs. Mayo was graduated as a nurse at Woman's hospital in Chicago 51 years ago this spring. She was the first trained nurse in Rochester. The Mayo family helped found St. Mary's hospital, and then started the clinic and school which made Rochester grow from a farming community of under 5,000 to a city of nearly 30,000. "It's getting too big," Mrs. Mayo says. "I like a neighborly little town."

Young mothers today are doing just as good a job as those of 30 years ago, Mrs. Mayo feels. "It's different now," she says. "There are so many outside interests. But I don't believe they are neglecting their children at all. They know so much more than we did, about vitamins and feeding of children, and those young women up at Rochester are just as good disciplinarians and just as good mothers as anybody could be."

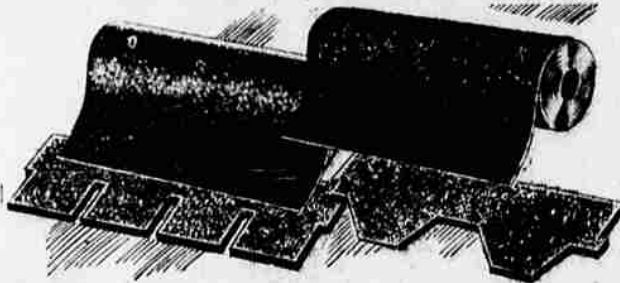
