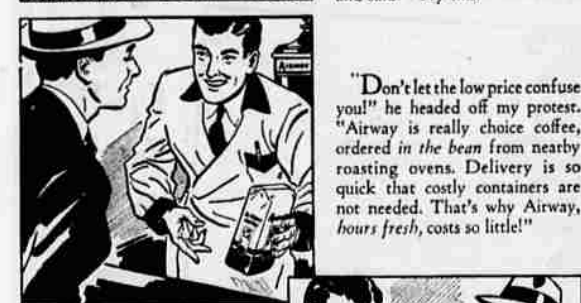

### Despondent Man Fires His Home, Kills Himself

SPOKANE, May 15.—(AP)—The charred body of B. J. Hansen, 57, was found yesterday in the ruins of the garage-basement of his Rockford district farm home which had been destroyed by fire.

Deputy Coroner Barnhart said Hansen had taken his own life with a shotgun after setting the place afire.

Dr. Barnhart said he learned Hansen had been despondent over ill health, his wife's sickness, finances and the invasion of his country by Germany.

Mrs. Hansen, ill with heart trouble in a Spokane hospital, was visited by her husband last Monday evening. She was not told of the tragedy.

A son and a daughter also survive.

### Book on Nudism Victor in Appellate Court Ruling

WASHINGTON, May 14.—(AP)—The United States court of appeals here decided today that there was as great a need "for freedom of scientific research and exposition" in the field of nudism as in any other field.

The court reversed a district tribunal's ruling that a book "Nudism in Modern Life" was properly subject to confiscation and destruction.

In an opinion from which Associate Justice Fred M. Vinson of Kentucky dissented, the court of appeals said that "it cannot be assumed that nudity is obscene per se and under all circumstances." "Nudity in art has long been recognized as the reverse of obscenity," the court added. The text and illustrations of the book in question, it said, were "clearly permitted by present day concepts of propriety."

### Poppies Arrive For Sale in Roseburg

Twenty-five hundred bright red poppies, crepe paper replicas of the famous poppies of Flanders fields, fill Legion headquarters here as the women of the American Legion auxiliary prepare for the annual observance of Poppy day on Saturday, May 25.

The poppies were made by disabled world war veterans of the local veterans facility. They show the patient and devoted work of these men who made them in remembrance of their departed comrades. All hand-made, the flowers vary slightly according to the skill of the veterans. The local men made 70,000 poppies, which were sent throughout the state.

"Poppy-making means much to the disabled veterans," explained Mrs. Harria Ellsworth, Poppy day chairman. "For those in the hospital, it provides an interesting occupation to fill the long hours of illness and convalescence. It has high value as occupational therapy, helping the men speed their recovery. It gives them the encouraging experience of again earning money and of being able to send money home to help support their families."

The poppy work rooms maintained by the auxiliary in a number of states, provide employment for disabled men outside the hospitals who are unable to do other work. For them the poppy work is an eagerly sought relief from unhappy idleness, from the almost hopeless search for a job their limited strength can perform, and a means of supporting themselves and families.

The disabled veterans are the only persons who receive pay for poppy work. The auxiliary women who handle and distribute the flowers serve as unpaid volunteers all contributions received on Poppy day going to support Legion and auxiliary efforts for the disabled and the needy families of veterans.



On the western side of the Grande Ronde Valley in the heart of the Blue Mountains in north-eastern Oregon, lie the 1,284,450 acres of Union county; 17th county in area; 17th in population, La Grande, located on Highway No. 30, and on the Union Pacific railroad, is the county seat of Union county. Union is second of Oregon counties in the production of barley and rye; third in wheat.

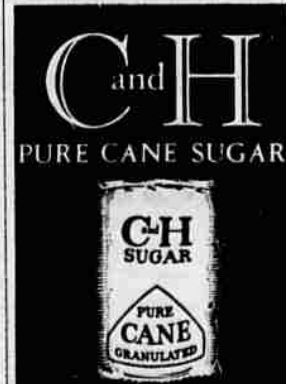
Fruits and vegetables are very important. Peaches, apricots, apples, prunes, cherries, berries, potatoes, and truck crops grow profitably. More than 100 ears of cherries and prunes are shipped annually. Union county is noted for its excellent cherries and apples.

Lumbering, railroad terminal, highway shops, dairy products, and fruit packing are the main industries of La Grande. "The Gem City." Union county is noted for its scenic grandeur—sharing with Baker county the Anthony Lake recreational area.

Union County has 554,600 acres of forest land on which there is approximately 3,175,000,000 board feet of standing timber. Here, too, are approximately 30,000 beef and dairy cattle; 6,200 horses and mules; 9,300 hogs; 47,000 sheep, and 67,000 chickens. Agricultural income from Union county is well over \$2,000,000 annually.

Cove, Elgin, Hilgard, Imbler, Island City, Kamela, North Powder, Summerville and Union are other Union county cities.
