RHS Grid Squad Loses Test Game

Roseburg high school's 1940 varsity material, small, light and completely inexperienced, was no match for the veteran senior combination, composed entirely of football veterans, which drubbed them, 26 to 0, in a practice tilt staged yesterday afternoon on Flinlay field as the climax to the spring training season.

The senior eleven, sparked by the elusive Pete Rutter, who was playing his first game in more than a year, had little difficulty rolling up the six-touchdown margin, scoring once in the opening quarter, three times in the second and once each in the last two stanzas. The winners were too heavy and too experienced for the youngsters whose lineup included mostly junior high school and sophomore players in action for the first time.

Coach Jim Watts used his entire squad of more than 25 players, keeping a steady stream of replacements going into the contest in order that every player could get a taste of being under fire. The embryo varsity team showed several flashes of defensive brilliance and displayed plenty of fight and determination. Poor quarterbacking, again from the lack of experience, nullified any attempts to unearth a scoring punch of their own.

The entire squad will turn in all equipment tonight, but on Monday, May 20, Coach Watts will turn the group over to Roseburg's new football coach, Jim Davis, present Reedsport high school mentor, who will conduct two weeks of spring football practice prior to the close of school. Coach Davis completes his work at Reedsport this week and will come here to initiate local grid talent into the mysteries of the Davis system. A large turnout of veterans and green material is expected to greet the new coach who will be in full charge of Roseburg high school football next fall.
