Feller Wins His Own Game 2 Ways

At St. Louis last night Feller pitched and batted the Cleveland Indians to a 3-2 decision over the Browns, allowing only seven scattered hits, striking out nine batters and helping himself to the first home run of his major league career.

The victory raised Feller into possession, possibly permanent, of the American league circuit's pitching lead with six wins and two losses.

In another night game, the New York Giants defeated the Boston Bees 8-1.

A pitching performance that rivalled Feller's was provided in the Chicago White Sox's 2-1 decision over the Detroit Tigers. Rigney permitted just three hits and fanned six. In seven of the nine frames he retired the Tigers in order.

Rigney's efforts were nearly matched by Tommy Bridges, who held Chicago to three hits in seven innings before giving way to a pinch-hitter.

These were the day's only major league games.

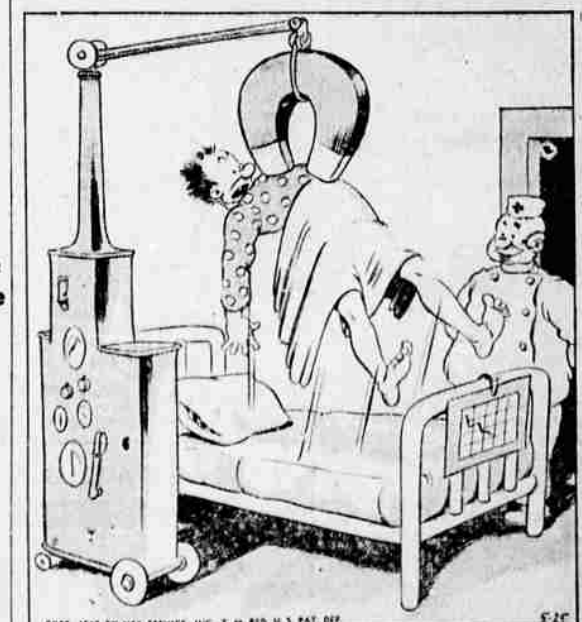
KINSHIP SPEED
