New Explosive Put Above TNT Power WASHINGTON, May 29.—(AP)—The senate naval committee said yesterday that "a reputable scientist" had reported discovery of an explosive approximately 100 times more powerful than TNT, most destructive of world war explosives. Formally reporting to the senate its approval of a bill to authorize emergency expansion of the navy air force, the committee urged that all new developments and new methods be given "careful and serious consideration, especially so in view of the fact that German success to date appears to be due in some measure at least to new developments in warfare." "The committee has received many suggestions regarding new devices for our national defense," the report said. "For example, a reputable scientist has informed the committee that he had discovered an explosive approximately a hundred times more powerful than TNT." At this point the committee report carried a parenthetical note saying the explosive in question was not the Barlow liquid-oxygen carbon bomb, recently tested by military experts. "Another (scientist) has informed the committee," the report continued, "that fuels have been developed which will increase the radius of action of our aircraft approximately 50 per cent."

Eighth Death Occurs in Tacoma Polio Epidemic

TACOMA, May 29.—(AP)—Another infantile paralysis death—the second in eight days—was recorded today as health officials intensified efforts to curb the epidemic.

A special clinic to examine suspected cases was set up in the county hospital today under Dr. Melvin Warren of Seattle's orthopedic hospital staff. Serum, brought here Monday from Chicago, will be given to patients showing a positive test.

Dr. Leland Powers, city health director, said there are 12 cases of "actual paralysis" and many "suspected cases." Two patients are in iron lungs. Five other respirators, one of them shipped from Boston, Mass., are also available.
