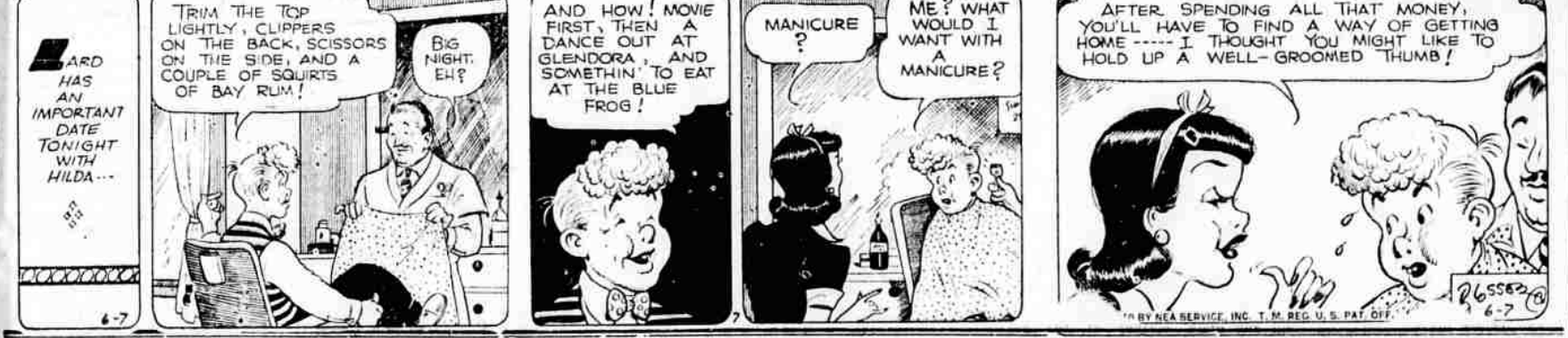

600 Will Trek To Oregon for Homes
GRANTS PASS, Ore., June 6.—(AP)—We're leaving Long Beach, 600 strong, on the 20th of June. I'm trying now to find a place for us to assemble and make camp here on our arrival," said R. J. Wilson, organizer of the "Pioneer club" of Long Beach, Calif., when he arrived here Wednesday.
Once a Portland deep-sea diver, Wilson was in the county assessor's office searching for record of the location of 180 acres of land given the club "within three miles of Grants Pass."
But by Thursday morning the property had not been located on the assessor's books.
Wilson added new touches to the original plans for the trek of 200 families here to log and build a modern community among the "stumps."
He expects the club will eventually own 20,000 acres of land and that his followers will live on tracts scattered from Grants Pass to Port Orford. In addition to building theaters, a hospital, etc., the club "will provide employment for 3,000 or 4,000 people and will have several manufacturing plants, three kinds of medicine, and erect a smelter in order to produce re-inforcing steel."
Nine of the club is with WPA, Wilson said, but he revealed the club intends to preserve its relief slightly in California by hurry-ing right back if the project fails. He will save \$1,000 of the sum raised by \$25 assessment to each family to finance the trip back south if necessary.
The immigrants will come in the face of almost unanimous skepticism and concern here.
Wilson said most of the club members are ex-Oregonians, homesick for this state. He put a few advertisements in Long Beach newspapers and they "came in swarms."
Nazi Envoy in Mexico Denies Air Base Rumors
MEXICO CITY, June 7.—(AP)—The German legation in an official statement charged today that reports of nazidirected "fifth column" activity in Mexico could be traced in part to the Dies committee on un-American activities.
The statement said: "The principal instigators of the propaganda which consists of provoking a state of unrest in the North American people are some persons well known in Mexico who in union with the inter-allied committee of propaganda have conspired with the North American Dies."
The legation attacked an unfounded charge by Representative Martin Dies (D., Tex.) that he had information that "several camouflaged German air bases exist south of the Rio Grande."

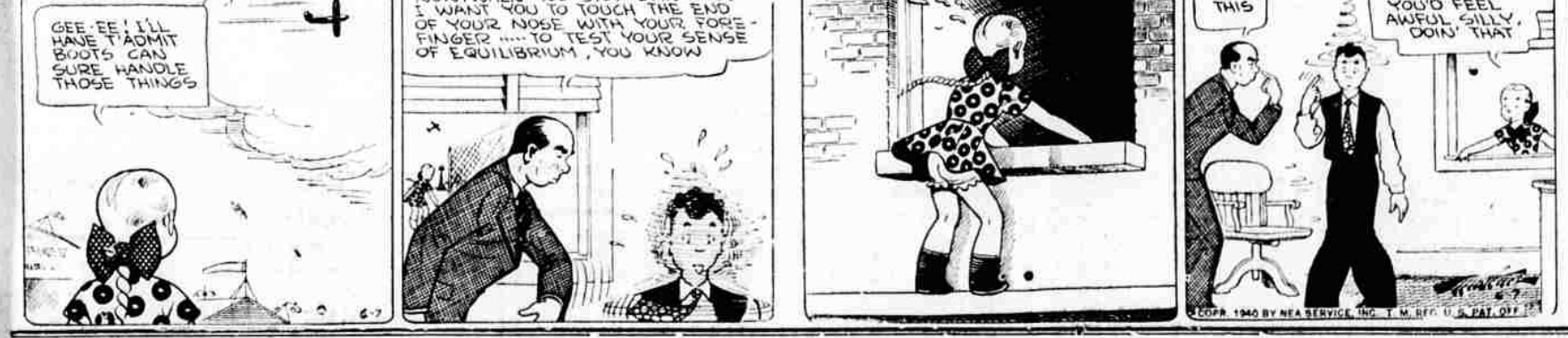
