Warship Oregon Scuttling Tried

Open Seacock Discovered After Boat Sinks 2 Feet; Saboteur or Juveniles Suspected.

PORTLAND, June 10.—(AP)—Portland police investigated today what Mayor Joseph K. Carson insisted was an effort to sabotage the battleship Oregon, once the pride of the fleet but now a naval museum piece.

The mayor's opinion was not completely shared, however, by Capt. S. A. Monroe, in charge of the long-decommissioned ship, who said the sinking might have been the work of juveniles.

One or more persons boarded the 44-year-old veteran of the battle of Santiago late Saturday, got into the after port shaft alley and opened a 10-inch seacock. When Assistant Custodian Thomas V. Pridoux discovered and stopped the leak at 6:30 a. m. Sunday the old battleship had taken in 600 tons of water and settled 24 inches in the stern.

The Oregon, given to Portland by the navy, is in a marine park lagoon off the Willamette river. Her harborage is 36 feet deep. Has Happened Before.

had to get through bulkhead doors, clamped tightly shut, but Monroe said of juveniles who occasionally visit the ship "when you close a door, that's the very place they want to go and they turn anything they can get their hands on. This happened twice before when the ship was at her old berth (she was moved to the recently-built marine park about a year ago from a moorage along the waterfront) only we caught it sooner on these occasions." He said the ship would have sunk within 24 hours of the time the open valve was discovered.

No Longer of War Value.

However officers continued to investigate the possibility a saboteur, on the mistaken notion the old boat might still have some combat value, tried to scuttle her. The Oregon was used as a training ship during the world war but her guns are too outmoded even for training value now, navy men said. Most of her machinery was removed under the 5-53 naval treaty with Japan and Britain.

In her day the Oregon was the most feared ship afloat. Her dash around the Horn to join the Atlantic fleet for the Santiago fight during the Spanish-American war added a bright page to American history and naval tradition.

NEW YORK, June 10.—(AP)—The Statue of Liberty became a sentinel of safety and peace today to new hundreds of American and alien refugees fleeing the violence and holocaust of European war.

The U. S. liner President Roosevelt, a "floating nursery" with 150 children among its 723 passengers, docked last night after a nightmare voyage of storm and terror from Galway, Ireland.
