C. M. T. C. Open To Douglas Youths

Opportunities for Douglas county youths for enlistment in the 1940 Citizens' Military Training camp are still open, despite the fact that the county quota already has been filled.

H. O. Pargeter, chairman, announced today. Although applications already have been approved to fill the quota of 12 recruits, allotted to Douglas county, Mr. Pargeter reported he had been informed today that authority has been granted for enlargement of the camp and that 300 applications can be accepted within the next two weeks.

The camp, which is to be held from July 2 to 31 at Vancouver barracks, Washington, is open to young men from 17 to 29 years of age, who can pass the physical tests and other eligibility requirements.

Attendance at the camp, Mr. Pargeter states, involves no military obligation. However, the chairman declares that in his opinion the training offers a fine experience for young men, regardless of military phases, and in the event of war, in which case military service would become compulsory, a student from the CMTC would be in line for prompt advancement which would add to his chances for survival.

Among those so far approved for this year's camp are Roger E. Olmstead, Roseburg; Stanley D. Esselstrom, Reedsport; Robert W. Bellows, Roseburg; Henry O. Wise, Reedsport; Alfred L. Richardson, Reedsport; Edgar A. Lewis, Roseburg; Paul E. Cacy, Roseburg; Paul G. Erno, Melrose; Royal S. Denton, Roseburg; and Raymond E. Dixon, Wilbur. Several additional applications are on file awaiting final approval.

The government rearmament program has so far brought no change in qualifications for enlistment in the regular army. Applicants must be citizens, unmarried, between 18 and 35, physically fit, of good character and normal intelligence.
