S. P. Co. Shortens Time on South-Bound Shasta

Effective Monday, June 17, southbound schedule of Southern Pacific's passenger train, the Shasta, will be shortened 15 minutes and the train will arrive in San Francisco at 8:50 a. m., an hour earlier than now applies, according to announcement by J. E. Clark, local agent.

Under the new schedule, connecting motor stage will leave Roseburg at 2 p. m. Instead of 2:30 p. m., arriving at Grants Pass at 4:32 p. m., connecting with the Shasta which will depart at 4:45 p. m. Instead of 5:30, and arrive at San Francisco at 8:50 next morning, instead of 9:50. This earlier arrival time will make the schedule much more desirable, according to Clark, as it will give more time for business or pleasure in San Francisco. Northbound schedule remains unchanged.

Ashes of Ex-Roseburg Residents Interred Here

The remains of Fred F. Jones, former Roseburg barber, and his wife, Susan A. Jones, have been interred in the Jones cemetery near Roseburg. It was announced today. Mrs. Jones died Dec. 14, 1939, and her husband passed away a month later, due to a sudden attack of a heart ailment.

The bodies were cremated at Santa Rosa, Calif., and the ashes were brought to Roseburg by Mrs. D. V. Allison, sister of Mr. Jones. Interment was made in the family cemetery Thursday.

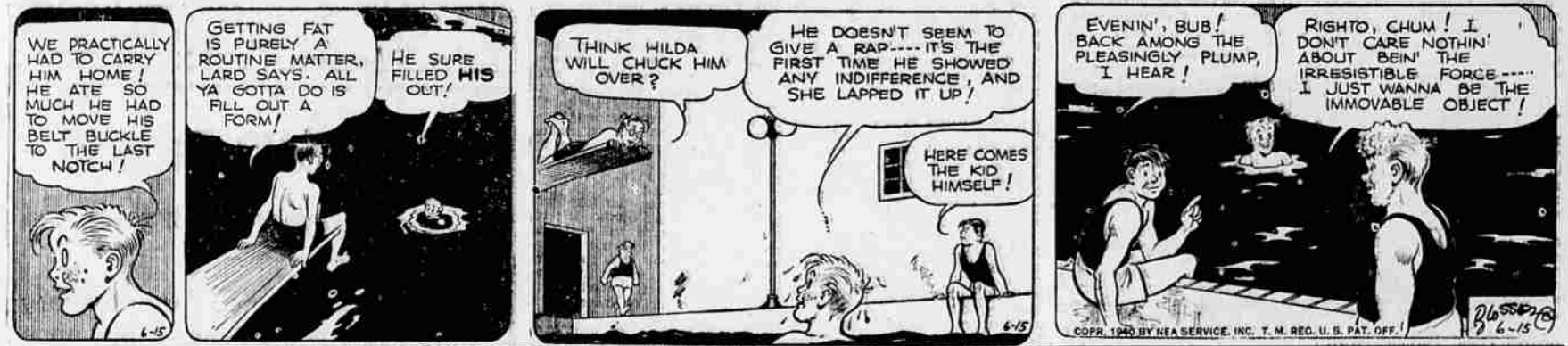

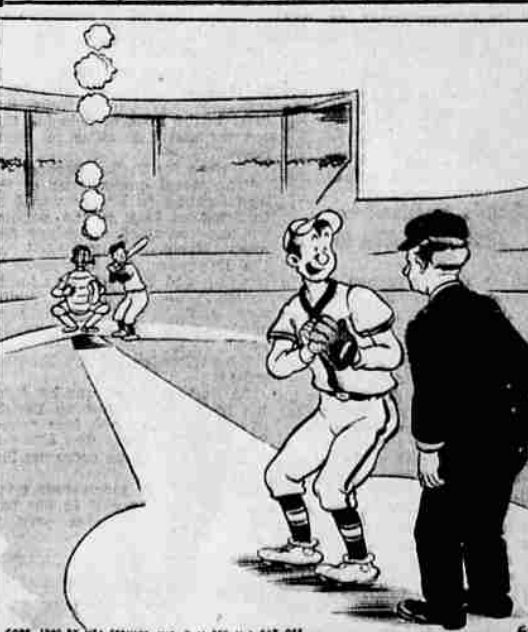
