Norwegians Have No Liking for Germans

SILVERTON, Ore., June 17.—(AP)—Mrs. A. T. Gunderson of Silverton received a letter yesterday from her sister in Harmond, Norway, which told in pocketbook language the effect of the Nazi invasion.

The salaries of Norwegians, she wrote, have been cut in half since the German occupation. Elsewhere the letter stated: "Because of the war the school children have been let out on vacation from April to August as the Germans are using the schoolhouses. . . . The Germans behave very nicely, but the population has let them know that they are not welcome in Norway. . . . The people of Norway were prohibited from celebrating the 17th of May, Norway's independence day."

Woodrow Wilson's Kin Joins Mystics

SEATTLE, June 17.—(AP)—The daughter of the American world war president was reported today to be living in seclusion from the world in a colony of religious mystics at Bonducherry, India.

George Nakashima, American-born Japanese architect and a graduate of the University of Washington, revealed on his return here from India that he had met Miss Margaret Wilson, daughter of President Woodrow Wilson, in the colony at Bonducherry, where Nakashima went to construct a dormitory for followers of the Dharma religious leader, Sri Aurobindo.

Miss Wilson, now 54 years old, entered the colony two years ago, Nakashima said, adding:

"She says she will never return to the outside world." The followers of Sri Aurobindo, Nakashima said, are members of a faith which involves recognition of multiple deity, Brahma, often pictured as a four-headed figure in religious art. The leader of the cult is a Hindu graduate of Cambridge university. Members of the colony are urged to work at tasks in which they are interested but obtain their material support largely from cult followers in the outside world.

Nakashima said the colony has an excellent library and includes several musicians and experts in various fields of endeavor.
