WASHINGTON, June 25.—(AP)—President Roosevelt announced today a program for voluntary training of men 19 to 25 years old who ultimately would receive commissions as officers in the navy.

Three battleships will be made available about July 18 for cruises, after which men who qualify through examinations will be eligible for a three-months course of instruction which would put them in line for commissions as ensigns in the navy.
