Morse Orders C.I.O. Crew to Resume Boat Loading

PORTLAND, Ore., June 26.—(AP)—Wayne L. Morse, west coast waterfront arbiter, ordered CIO longshoremen to resume loading the freighter Portland at the N. F. Johnson mill dock here today.

Portland waterfront employers charged the dockmen were in collusion with CIO lumberworkers who picketed the plant but Morse said he found no such evidence. He ruled at a hearing last night that since a restraining order was issued against picketing June 21 no legal line existed.

Longshoremen recognized the line and refused to pass it to work the ship.

Two more pickets were arrested on contempt of court charges at the mill yesterday, bringing to 13 the total number detained.

Nazi-Fascist Propagandists Active in U. S.

WASHINGTON — The Nazi-fascist element of America's fifth column has a potential strength of a million, according to the best estimates of government investigators.

It is stronger than the fifth column that gnawed the foundations of Poland, Norway and Holland.

Its members are being encouraged in activities of increasing scope and danger by newly arrived foreign agents.

These Germans come via Siberia, Japan and Mexico. By the same routes, information about our defense program is sent out; some is radioed from Mexico. Via Siberia, sometimes by clipper airmail, Nazi propaganda in increasing amounts reaches here. Government information shows that some of this propaganda follows exactly the same pattern employed to rot Dutch loyalty before the German invasion.

Use High Sounding Names.

Nazi propaganda is followed up by the band through the medium of "American" organizations with high-sounding patriotic names, behind which the now discredited Nazi group camouflages its Trojan horse tactics. Band members join many of these organizations. Joe McWilliams of the "Christian Mobilizers" boasts an "army of 10,000." The Christian Front trials exposed only one of many "action committees." While the government now believes the front is broken, at recent meetings band literature was distributed and
