Reported Attack on U. S. Destroyer Proves False

WASHINGTON, July 8.—(AP)—The United States destroyer Barry was reported safely at anchor in European waters today, while federal agents tried to run down the author of a mysterious message saying that she had been "hit by German submarine."

An SOS in the Barry's name was picked up by Mackay radio Sunday, and caused two hours' anxiety in government quarters before the navy was able to announce: "The navy has received a communication directly from the Barry and she is not in distress. She is peacefully at anchor."

The navy declined to give out her position.

Willkie Takes Rap At Anti-Semitism

Nominee Against Race Hatred, Hitlerism; Tells How He Would Erase New Deal.

NEW YORK, July 8.—(AP)—Wendell L. Willkie said in an interview published Saturday in the Jewish daily, 'The Day,' that "I consider anti-Semitism in America as a possible criminal movement and every anti-Semite as a possible traitor to America."

"What man with a conscience," the republican presidential nominee was quoted, "what man who knows the suffering of Israel and what Israel has tried to accomplish and has accomplished in the march of humanity, cannot be tolerant toward Israel?"

"I... clearly asserted my position against race hatred, bigotry and Hitlerism... long before I even thought of being a presidential candidate. I did it solely because I wanted to express my protest against Hitlerism and against all fascist persecution methods."

"If anti-Semitism should spread its roots in the United States as it has done in most of the countries of Europe, then it would definitely be a calamity for the United States."

ST. PAUL, July 8.—(AP)—Here's a little reminder for democrats who may be wondering just where the Wendell Willkie lightning is going to strike during the approaching presidential campaign: The republican nominee has already outlined his formula for "getting rid of the new deal," and it's open to the inspection of all concerned.

U. S.-Made Planes Prove Superiority

Taking Heavy Toll of German Craft, Thus Far Unable to Destroy One in Return.

By W. T. YARBROUGH AT A BRITISH AIRDRIVE, July 8.—(AP)—Ordinary American transport planes with the seats taken out and bomb racks and gun turrets put in have become Britain's "wizards" of the air.

Young pilots who showed American reporters around this airdrome and took them on a short over-water demonstration flight, called their stubby, twin-motored California-made Lockheed "wizards" because:

- 1. Although they started out primarily as scouting planes, they were found enough for fighting and bombing, and have shot down more German planes than any other British type except the Spitfire and Hurricane fighters.
2. No German Messerschmitt has been able to shoot one down.
3. They have been dived at more than 400 miles an hour.
4. They are so sturdy that one

Professor Goldenweiser of U. of O. Staff Dies

PORTLAND, Ore., July 8.—(AP)—A heart attack was fatal here Saturday to Alexander Goldenweiser, 60, University of Oregon extension school professor of anthropology and sociology.

Born at Kiev, Russia, Goldenweiser was a classmate of President Roosevelt at Harvard and was a former Columbia university, New York, faculty member. He also served as professor at the University of Washington, Stanford and the University of Buffalo.
