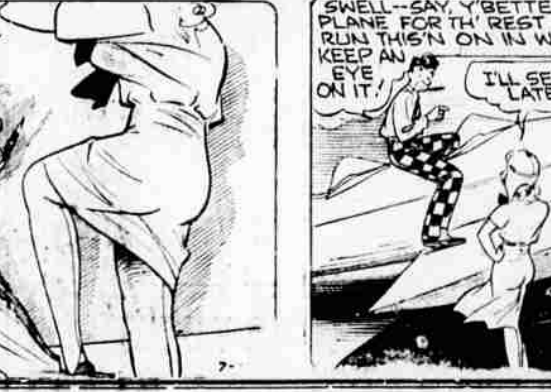

 Filmed in the awesome beauty of majestic Death Valley, "Twenty Mule Team" gives Beery ample opportunity to portray his usual blustering, cussing, onery, likeable role, this time as "Skinner Bill" Brag, mule-skinner for the Desert Route company. Though the picture as a whole falls far below the usual Beery standard, it is still good entertainment.
