HILLSBORO, July 18.—(AP)—
District Attorney G. Russell Mor-
gan said today Ellis Miller, 37,
Jewell logger, admitted cigarettes
he threw away started the fire
which destroyed West Timber and
burned 485 acres July 2.

Morgan quoted Miller as say-
ing he crawled under an old
West Timber sawmill, being dis-
mantled by the Alaska Junk com-
pany, smoked several cigarettes,
tossed the butts away, then mov-
ed to another spot under the mill
to "sleep."

Stockton, Calif., lost his 1939 se-
dan and more than \$225 in paper
currency Wednesday when his cig-
arette missed the ash receptacle
in his car, he told state police who

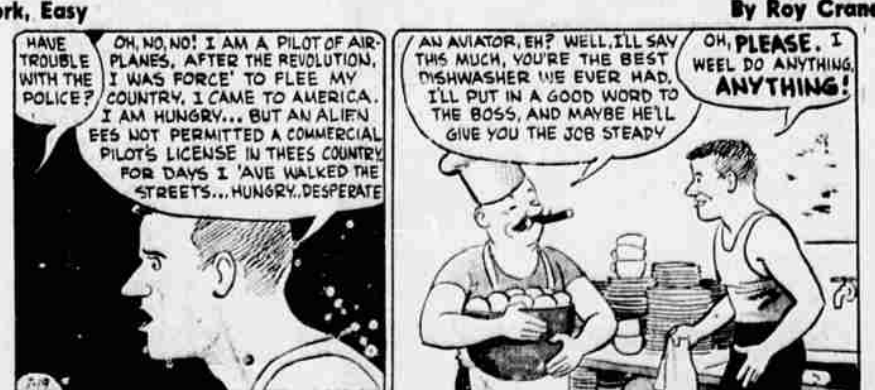
