4 Ex-Congressmen Trying Come-Back

AUSTIN, Tex., July 23.—(AP)—Comeback efforts of four former representatives and the 12-men race for the post to be relinquished by the veteran Marvin Jones of Amarillo highlight democratic congressional contests in Texas. Most of them probably will be decided in the first primary Saturday.

The democratic nomination almost always is equivalent to election in this state. The quartet seeking return to congress are Joe H. Eagle of Houston, O. H. Cross of Waco, W. D. McFarlane of Graham and Thomas L. Blanton of Albany. Their districts are represented respectively by Albert Thomas of Houston, W. R. Poage of Waco, Ed Gossett of Wichita Falls and Clyde L. Garrett of Eastland.

Twenty of the state's 21 congressmen are seeking re-election. The only exception is Rep. Jones, chairman of the house agriculture committee. Seven are without opposition.

There are no outstanding issues. One candidate advocates socialized medicine, another \$45 federal pensions to all over 60 and a third the Townsend plan.

Admittedly it is no easy task under normal conditions to defeat a Texas congressman.

Will Sing Tonight at Presbyterian Church

Rev. Morris H. Roach, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, of Roseburg, announces that tonight's service of sacred music in this community will have the opportunity of hearing Mr. and Mrs. Reid C. Cochran of Modesto, Calif., in a sacred concert entitled "Famous Hymns With a Story." The concert will be given at the Presbyterian church at 8 p. m.

Rev. Mr. Roach says Mr. Cochran is known as a singer of ability in his own state, as a church choir director and soloist and also in secular music as a singer and teacher and as a radio singer of the gospel. Mr. Cochran has studied voice with several of the country's greatest teachers, among whom are Louis Graveure and Alexander Kisselburgh. He gives an hour's entertainment, singing some of the greatest hymns of the church and telling something about the composer's life or some incident in connection with the use of the song by famous singers.

Mrs. Cochran is accompanist. She is a teacher of piano in Modesto and a pupil of the well-known Olga Steeb. The Cochrans come highly recommended by pastors of other churches on the Pacific coast, where they have appeared, Mr. Roach states.

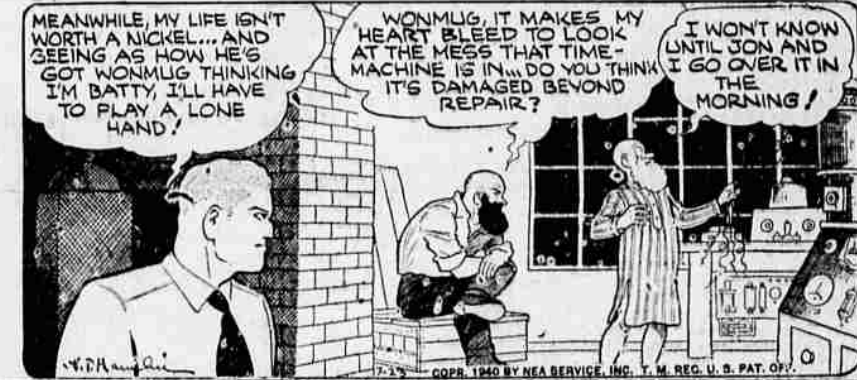
