Dunham's tied the score in their half of the third when Domenico singled and scored on Henry's triple, the latter scoring on a fly to the outfield.

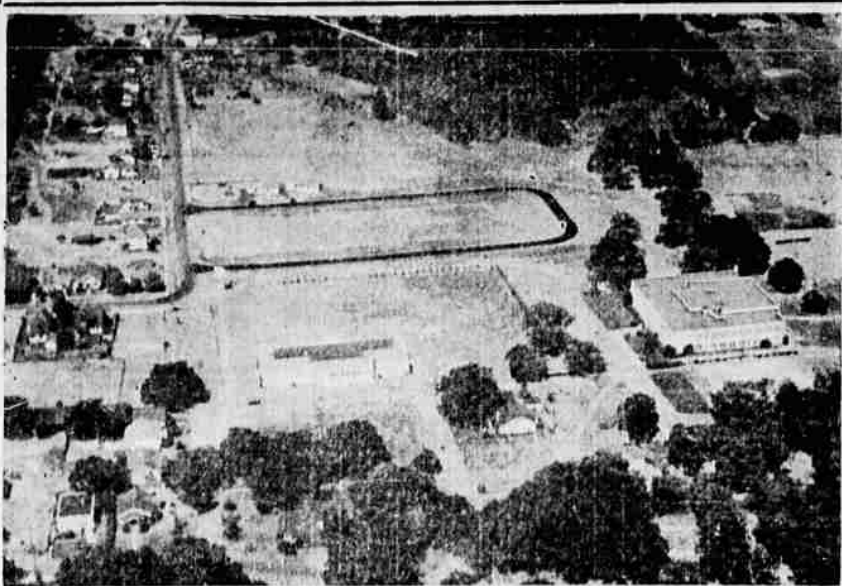
The Elks jumped into a one-run lead in the fifth as Robertson tripled and scored on Walcott's single.

Houses in New District Open to Public Inspection

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Detroit's Lead in American Boosted

The Detroit Tigers yesterday continued their near-miraculous winning and built their American league lead back to a game and a half as the Cleveland Indians lost.

The Tigers were outbatted by the Washington Senators 9-8, but triumphed 5-2 with the help of three Washington errors.

The Indians had won five games in a row before folding in front of the Philadelphia Athletics 7-0. Chapman sent the A's away on the right foot with a two-run homer in the first frame and Buck Ross protected the lead with 10-hit pitching.

New York's Yankees came out of a five-game losing streak with a 13-8 victory over the St. Louis Browns in a 25-hit ball game. Ruffing went the route for his ninth victory, giving in a dozen hits. Gordon hit two home runs and Joe Dimaggio extended his hitting streak to 18 consecutive games by getting two doubles and a single.

Chicago's White Sox brought them seven victories in a row.

The sensational streak has lifted the Sox to within a game of the first division and they'll have a chance to move right into the upper story if they can conquer the New York Yankees in their series this weekend. They already have won seven of the 12 games they have played with the crumbling world champions.

The secret of the Sox success is that they are simply overpowering their opponents. They haven't made less than 11 hits in any game during their present winning string. That was their total in beating the Boston Red Sox 6-4 yesterday and it included Kuhl's 18th homer, three triples and two doubles. It was the eighth consecutive defeat for Boston.

The National league program was a more two games, with the Pittsburgh Pirates outting the New York Giants through a 2-1 win in one and the Chicago Cubs crushing the Boston Bees 8-4 in the other.

Seattle Loses 2 Games to Portland

The Pacific Coast league's second division clubs, all but San Francisco, put on a revolution last night and trampled on their better teams.

Portland, the uncomplaining champion, went completely unopposed and annihilated the title-bound Rainiers of Seattle in both ends of a night doubleheader, 7 to 4 and 5 to 4, to even the series at three-all.

Hollywood clubbed the second-place Acoms of Oakland, 5 to 1, for three straight; Sacramento blasted San Diego 7 to 1, and San Francisco decisively outlasted Los Angeles but lost the battle, 12 to 6.

The lowly Portland Beavers, apparently thriving on a diet of 11 home games in six days, went into the last inning of the nightcap with a 4 to 3 lead over the Rainiers. Seattle tied it up.

The Rose City fans, who nowadays never expect to go home from the Portland park on the same day they arrived, groaned for it looked like extra innings for the third night in a row. But in the Portland half Pitcher Walker filled the bases and then issued a walk to lose his ball game.

The pitchers stole the show in the rest of the league. Fleming of Hollywood fanned nine and gave only six hits in setting down the Oaks, who skidded to 11 games behind the Rainiers.
