Economic Threat From Nazis Seen

Congressman Pierce Points to Trade Obstacles, Favors Strong Navy and Army.

WASHINGTON, July 31.—(AP)—Representative Pierce (D., Ore.) told the house in discussing world conditions that he believed Hitler probably would not seek to invade

the United States but would fight us economically.
"Our surplus agriculture and industrial products cannot be sold in Hitler dominated countries without Hitler's permission," Pierce said. "The fight at first is going to be in the economic world where we are at a great disadvantage."

Pierce believed it was necessary for the United States to "throw a ring of steel" around every island in the Caribbean sea, the northern part of South America, the Panama Canal, Central America, Mexico and Canada.
He added that he had reluctantly reached the conclusion the United States must adopt some kind of selective service to raise an army.

"It is my belief that a selective service program is our only hope and protection and that it is a satisfactory and just plan for democracy," Pierce said.
"I believe American young men will willingly subscribe to the pledge adopted by a church conference recently: 'We pledge ourselves to any sacrifice that may be required for the defense of democracy against every foe, without and within.'"
Pierce stated that the nation's system of taxation must be revised and control of production adopted. "We can sell but precious little in Asia, with Japan controlling the sea lanes," he continued. "We can sell none in Africa, and if we are sensible, we must know that we are barred from Hitler-controlled countries in Europe. We might as well face the facts and allow no dema-

gogue to tell us that the American farmer will have freedom to produce as he sees fit. Because of the changes in Europe, that control must reach, I fear, into every farm, hamlet and village in this broad land, from ocean to ocean.

West Hemisphere Pact Needs Okayes

HAVANA, Aug. 1.—(AP)—The 21 American republics formally presented a united front today against political and economic dangers from other continents in a three-point program which Secretary of State Hull regarded with deep satisfaction despite last-minute reservations by eight nations.
The Havana conference, after setting up new machinery to bolster the solidarity of the western hemisphere, concluded with formal signature of documents amid flourish of cheers.
All the delegates signed the "act of Havana" and supplementary agreements, although the Argentine delegation—which had argued against anticipating need of action concerning European colonies in the new world—led seven other nations in a succession of reservations.
The delegates of Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Uruguay and Venezuela specified that the agreements be ratified by their governments before participation. Mexico, Bolivia and Peru made reservations as to minor points.
The program consists of:
1. The act of Havana declaring all of the republics opposed to transfer to other non-American na-

tions or attempt to transfer or acquire interest in European possessions in this hemisphere.
2. Inter-American cooperation, through consultation and mutual exchange of information, to combat "fifth columnist" or other subversive elements.
3. Mutual effort to settle American economic problems, including market dislocations resulting from the European war, and "economic defense" against encroachment of European barter systems.

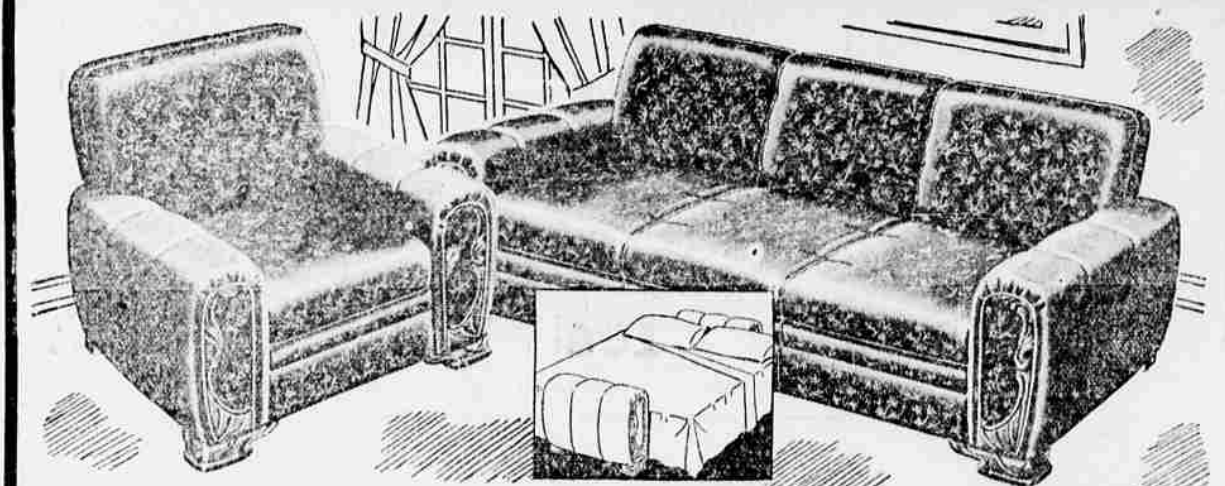
