"Ham 'n' Egg" Pension Backers Lose Court Round

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 23.—(AP)—"Ham and eggs" old age pension advocates today lost a court fight to bring their plan for retirement warrants before California voters for a third time at the election in November.

The state supreme court refused to compel the secretary of state and the registrars of Los Angeles, Ventura and Alameda counties to certify some 7,000 signatures, which the pension advocates said would be sufficient to place the twice-defeated plan on the ballot this year.

The proponents had fallen 1,550 signatures short of the 212,117 required to put the plan on the November ballot.

Portland, Aug. 23.—(AP)—The Multnomah county unit of the communist party has no business speaking for the CIO, William Dalgryple, congress director for Oregon, wrote CIO unions yesterday.

He charged that communists hereabouts had interfered with CIO affairs and said the CIO was "an American labor organization" with no communistic attachments.
