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Defense Status of Agriculture Good

FALLS CITY, Neb., Aug. 28.—(AP)—Agriculture is better prepared than any other industry to help outwark democracy in a war-ridden world, Claude R. Wickard, newly appointed secretary of agriculture, asserted in an address here yesterday.

"Through the farmer's foresight, with the help of the farm program," he said, "the nation today has an abundance of those farm products which are as essential in war-time as the guns and munitions."

He came here to speak before a four-state farm rally in the first prepared address since his appointment to succeed Henry A. Wallace, democratic vice-presidential nominee whose policies Wickard pledged to "continue and strengthen."

A strong American agriculture, Wickard declared, is essential "if we are to meet the challenge of aggressor nations."

"To let agriculture go through another period of farm strikes, penny sales and farm foreclosures comparable to that of the late twenties and early thirties could well be fatal in this day of economic wars. Aggressor powers seek such weaknesses as a means of penetration. A vital part of our national defense is guarding against such weaknesses."

He pointed out European block-

ades are causing "a severe loss in our export trade" and that it is impossible to predict "how much more serious this 'blackout' of markets may get."

"A totalitarian victory would almost certainly see all Europe organized into a single, huge bargaining agency. If we may judge by past experience, this agency will be concerned with the economic domination of the countries with which it trades. Military domination is but a step from there."

West Claimed For GOP By Martin

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 27.—(AP)—Most of the west will go republican in the November elections, Rep. Joseph Martin (R-Mass.), GOP national chairman, predicted here today.

The republican leader, here for Senator Charles L. McNary's notification of his selection as vice-presidential nominee, made these pronouncements:

Washington—"At present '50-50' between republicans and democrats, but 'after Wendell Willkie's visit in late September, I am positive Washington will be a republican state."

Oregon—"Safe" for the GOP.

Idaho, Wyoming, North Dakota and South Dakota—"All republican."

Montana—"Situation 'good'—a little better than 50-50 for Willkie and McNary."

Utah—"A real republican state."

California—"Steadily improving—we haven't given up hope there yet."

Arizona and New Mexico Martin declined to rate "because I haven't visited either state."

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 27.—(AP)—The American people believe the third term "is one tradition that should never be broken," Harold Stassen of Minnesota said today.

The 33-year-old executive, en route to Salem, to notify Senator Charles L. McNary of his nomination for vice president, told interviewers:

"I have had democrats walk up to me and say they had been voting democratic tickets straight for 40 years but this year they were going for Willkie and McNary, believing that the principles laid down by Washington and Jefferson are mighty good ideas and should not be abandoned now."

He predicted the northwest would "adopt" Wendell Willkie, the republican presidential nominee, "as soon as it gets a look at him."

"The amateurs, as they call those of us supporting Willkie and McNary, will run the republican campaign," he said. "The bosses will run the big city machines in favor of the third term and it won't do them any good either."
