(Continued from page 1) Britain had designs on rich oil supplies now under the wing of the German air force. Britons continued to leave Rumania for Turkey and Greece. Greece closely watched her Albanian border where thousands of fascist troops have been concentrated. With the departure of the last British national from Rumania, severance of British-Rumanian diplomatic relations was expected. The pro-Nazi Rumanian government began selecting iron guard members to take complete control of the American-owned Rumanian telephone company in a program to place all foreign-owned companies in the hands of iron guard directores.

Local Alleys Join National Carnival

The Roseburg Bowling Alleys will join in the national bowling carnival which starts today and continues for eight full weeks, Floyd Baughman, owner-manager reports. The carnival, in which \$50,000 is offered in the form of prizes, is open to every bowler in participating alleys throughout the country and every bowler, Mr. Baughman states, has an equal chance to win. The opportunity to win prizes is made equal by a division of bowlers into classes ranging from beginners to stars so that lack of bowling ability does not in any way hamper the opportunity of a novice to share equally with an expert. The carnival is offered for the purpose of encouraging open bowling. Scores in league games are not included in competition. To participate in the contest a bowler must complete three consecutive games. For each three lines he will be issued an entry blank by the alley management. On this blank his scores will be entered and verified by the alley proprietor and will be mailed to the national carnival headquarters to be included in the contest. The contests are held week-by-week for eight consecutive weeks with 2,190 prizes in the form of cash, bowling balls, shoes, trophies, coupon books, etc., to be distributed weekly. Full particulars are available at the bowling alley.
