Hull Draws Reply On Defense Talk

ABOARD WILKIE TRAIN EN ROUTE TO LOUISVILLE, Oct. 28. (AP)—Wendell L. Wilkie asserted today that Secretary of State Hull's speech Saturday night was "an extraordinary documentation of new deal failure."

Commenting on the secretary of state's speech in Washington Saturday night, Wilkie said Hull "has made it more than ever obvious that such a defense was essential to the maintenance of our influence in foreign affairs."

Had the president not then also been a candidate for re-election, he might have done better than merely send up verbal trial balloons to see how the popular emotion ran toward foreign events.
