AMENDMENT MAKING THREE VEARS AVERAGE PEOPLE'S VOTED LEVIES, TAX BASE. Purpose: Amending section II, Article XI of state constitution, being the six percent imitation, to include the following: Whenever a majority of the legal voters of any county, municipality or district voting thereon shall have authorized specifically a tax levy in each of three successive years, the average of such levies for purposes other than payment of bonded indebt edness or interest thereon, shall become the tax base of such taxing district for the next year following such period. The tax base of newly organized municipalities or districts hot formerly parts of like municipalities or districts shall be established in like manner. Vote YES or NO

AMENOMENT REPEALING THE DOUBLE LIABILITY OF STOCKHOLDERS OF STATE BANKS—Purpose: To amend section 5 of Article XI of the state constitution by repeating the provision now contained therein which is known as the double liability of stockholders of state banks to the depositors of said banks, so that said section as so amended will read: "The stockholders of all corporations and joint stock companies shall be liable for the indebtedness of said corporations to the amount of their stock subscribed and unpaid and no more

LEGISLATORS COMPENSATION CONSTITUTIONAL AMEND-MENT-Purpose. Fixing legislature members pay at 48 a day while in regular session and for not more than 50 day while in expairs session and for not more than 50 days; while in extra accession; \$5 a day, no extra session to be longer than 20 days; members also to receive 10 cents per mile traveled to and from meeting place; presiding officers to receive one-half daily pay additional; such componention being instead of that now received which is: \$3 a day but not over \$120 for any session, no extra session being over 20 days, and \$5 for every 20 miles traveled; presiding officers receiving two thirds daily pay additional. AMENDMENT LEGALIZING CERTAIN GAMBLING AND GAM-ING DEVICES AND CERTAIN LOTTERIES—Purpose: legalizes marble boards, pin-ball games, claw or digger games and other gambling and gaming devices, punch-boards, similar devices, bank night, similar lotteries and Bingo games; other games wherein skill may predominate; lingo games; other games wherein skill may predominate; all to be exclusively licensed by state. Cities to license other legalized games. Parl-mutuel wagering and animal racing legalized; fees therefrom deposited in fund hereby created. Prohibits nickel-in-the-slot machines. Secretary of state to issue licenses, employ attorney, assistant, clerks; no salary thereof exceeding \$6,000 annually. Appropriates \$50,000 state tunds, repayable from fees. License three dishursed to make laber assistant. proceeds disbursed to public fairs, expositions, cities and to counties for old-age and public assistance.
