Paris Resistance To Axis Induces U. S. Envoy Return

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.-(AP) -Relations between the United States and France entered an ap-

States and France cutored an ap-parently new phase today, coinci-dent with the increasing reports that Marshal Petain was showing a disposition to go slow in collabor-ating with the axis powers. First tangible sign of a possible change was the fact that Robert D. Murphy, a veteran of ten years diplomatic service in France before and during the war, was ordered back to Vichy to take up the duites of charge d'affaires. Murphy, for-mer counsellor at the Paris em-bases, has been in this country for several months.

The impression appeared to be The impression appeared to be prowing here in government quar-ters that Petala personally was of-fering strong resistance to axis pressure on some points of vital concern to the United States, par-locularly the use of French naval bases in Africa and some of the Densed form

bases in Africa and some of the French fleet. Petain's protest over German expulsion of the French population from Lorraine was regarded here as a sign that the aged chief of state was drawing a line on the extent of collaboration with the axis

extent of collaboration with the axis. More immediate diplomatic in-terest attached to the continued pressure in North Africa of genoral Maxime Weygand, former French generalissimo and commander of French forces in the near east. He is reported to have resisted efforts of some French officials to induce him to return to France. France has large forces of profes-sional soldiers still under arms in parts of Africa and in Syria. If ax-is pressure on the French should provoke forcible resistance again, these armies might prove a big stumbling block to Rome-Berlin plans for the Mediterranean area.


