BOSTON, Dec. 27.—(AP)—The Commercial Bulletin will say tomorrow:
"The week in the wool trade has been extremely dull, as was to be expected with Christmas breaking the week in two and manufacturers well covered against heavy orders for several months to come, so that they are rather indifferent to wool purchases just now."
"Civilian business is slow but a good heavyweight season is expected to develop later. Spinnings and topmakers are chiefly concerned about getting out their orders at the moment and report little new interest."
"Foreign markets are hardly changed. Prices are just about where they were a week ago in South America, Australia and South Africa are still fixed on the same level, with rather quiet business."
"The west is, of course, very quiet, with little wool left to sell and some holders a bit restless and seeking offers."
"Mohair is quiet here and in the west with prices steady."
