

Farm Program To Be Drawn for 1941 By Pomona Grange

Recommendations Offered at Conference of Leaders and Others Held in Roseburg

An agricultural program which will improve conditions for marketing of farm crops and improve relations between grower, distributor and consumer is being planned under grange sponsorship, according to Fred A. Goff, chairman of Douglas County Pomona grange agricultural committee.

The grange also is expected to undertake a study of commodity prices on farm crops during market season.

Lower Prices Cited Producers of turkeys in Douglas county, it is claimed, were forced to take a large dip in the price of their birds during the Christmas holiday season.

Continuation of the pest hunt for 1941, extension of the weed control program, and continued support for 4-H club work and the activities of the Future Farmers of America are among other projects expected to gain grange support in the county-wide program, Mr. Goff reports.

The projects are being outlined following an interesting conference held Monday at the courthouse, at which time officers of the subordinate granges heard discussions of numerous topics pertaining to agriculture.

The various phases of farm, crop and livestock financing were discussed by representatives of federal agencies.

Interesting Talks Heard Of particular local interest were talks by E. A. Britton, county 4-H club leader; Homer Grow, Smith-Hughes agricultural teacher in the Roseburg schools and V. V. Harpham, forest supervisor.

Mr. Britton outlined some of the recent activities of 4-H clubs and discussed plans for the coming year.

Mr. Grow made a report on the agricultural work in the Roseburg schools and particularly interested his listeners with an explanation of the new national defense training program, which offers an opportunity to young men for training in special vocations connected with the defense program.

Mr. Harpham, discussed the relationship between forests and farms, presented interesting figures with regard to timber resources in Douglas county, pointing out that the present timber cut of 150 million feet annually is about one-fourth of the amount available on a sustained yield basis.

Roosevelt's Friend Prisoner of Nazis

BERLIN, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Captain Charles Davis Morgan, 56, United States citizen and college days friend of President Roosevelt, is in a German prison camp, the United States embassy disclosed today.

Morgan, whose wife, Louise Warfield Morgan of Baltimore, is a cousin of the Duchess of Windsor, was captured early in June while fighting in the British army in the battle of Flanders, the embassy said.

Morgan's case has been carried to the white house by various friends. It was disclosed, but under international law he is factually a British soldier because he joined the British forces and took part in combat.

His case is thus distinguished from those of American ambulance drivers who already have been released. They were non-combatants. The Germans indicated they would have been willing to release Morgan, but were afraid it would set a precedent for similar treatment for American pilots whom they expect may be brought down in British planes.
