This picture, one of the first transmitted with resumption of radio facilities between London and New York, is the first from London showing identifiable bombed areas. The Myrtle Creek Vikings defeated Glendale, 31 to 29, Tuesday night at Myrtle Creek in a basketball game that required two overtime periods.

The Glendale Pirates held a 9 to 4 lead in the first quarter and were out in front 12 to 6 at half-time. The visitors maintained a dwindling margin until midway in the last period, when Myrtle Creek tied the score at 23-all and the regular playing period ended with the score tied 25-25.

In the first overtime period of three minutes Glendale tossed two baskets and appeared to have the game on ice, but in the last 13 seconds the Vikings looped two long shots to again knot the count at 29-all.

The rules provide that in the second or "sudden death" period, the first team to score two points

becomes the winner. Myrtle Creek won the game through conversion of two free throws. In the preliminary volleyball game, the Glendale girls won by a score of 41 to 28.

The victory won by the Myrtle Creek basketball team from Glendale was the second close contest to be won by the Vikings in the past week, the Myrtle Creek players having taken a one-point victory, 28 to 27, at Oakland Friday night.

The Vikings had a lead of 14 to 6 over Oakland at the halfway mark, but the Gobblers were within one point 17 to 18 at the fourth period in virtue of a third quarter rally. During the final minutes of play the score was tied several times, but a free throw conversion gave Myrtle Creek the one-point lead which won the game.

The Myrtle Creek girls were beaten 20 to 12 in the preliminary.
