Japs Beaten if Deprived Of Glass, Officer Claims

PORTLAND, Jan. 14.—(AP)—Jack Mills, for 10 years a sergeant with the Shanghai police force, has a plan to defeat the Japanese.

Just bomb the Japanese spectacle factories.

"Seventy-five per cent of Japanese are nearsighted," he said on arrival here after retiring from the Shanghai force. "If the glass factories of Japan were destroyed, the nation would go blind."

To prove his point, Mills cited examples of what he called inaccurate Japanese bombing in Shanghai and said so far as he knows only one Nipponese flier has tried dive-bombing. That one failed to pull out of the dive.

He predicted eventual defeat for the Japanese.

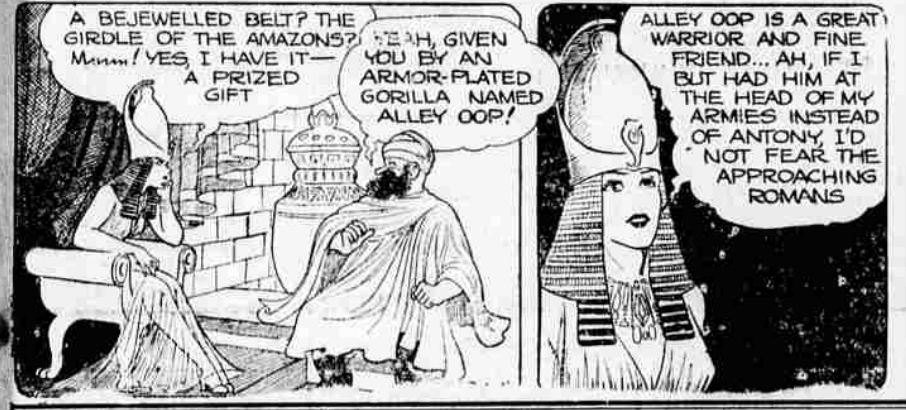

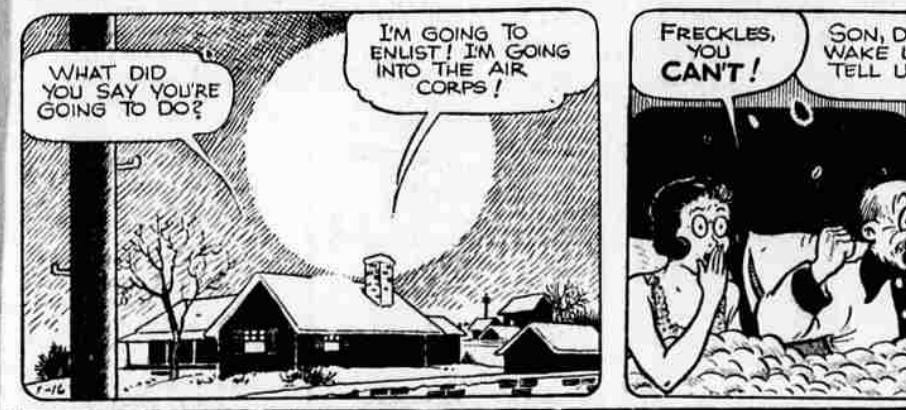

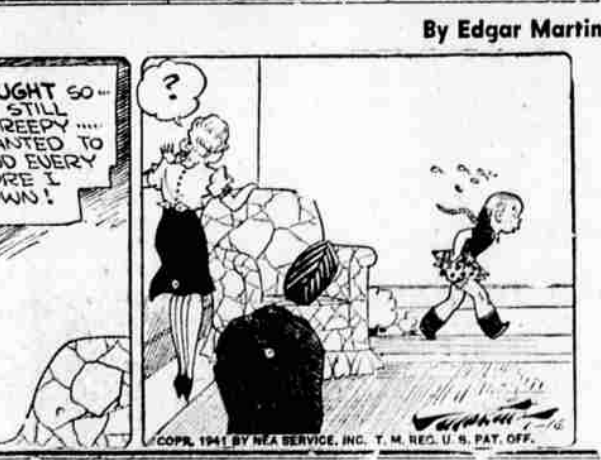
