Indian Hoopsters Dated for Battles With Two Teams

Following the successful opening of the conference basketball season on their home floor, the Roseburg Indians travel south this weekend to meet Ashland Friday night and Grants Pass Tuesday night. Coach Jim Watts, well pleased with the second-half rally by the Indians in their game against Ashland Saturday night, let his boys off with a light workout Wednesday.

The Indians are anticipating a tough battle at Ashland where the Grizzlies will have the advantage of their own floor plus a determination to avenge the defeat here.

The Grants Pass team now is in bottom place in the district, having suffered a defeat at the hands of Medford, following the trouncing by Roseburg Saturday. This Saturday night, however, Grants Pass will be in a better

opportunity for a victory, as the Indians will be tired from travel and the Ashland struggle, while the Cavemen, with no games booked, will be rested and fresh.

Due to this situation, the Indians, despite their success in taking the first three conference games in a row, are not over-confident and will take the southern jaunt with the idea in mind that they will have to work hard for victories.

Coupled with Hughes and Schrimpf for next season doubtless will be Wimberly, Ness, Cacy, Denny, Baker and others, who are gaining a great deal of experience on the B squad and are showing rapid development.
