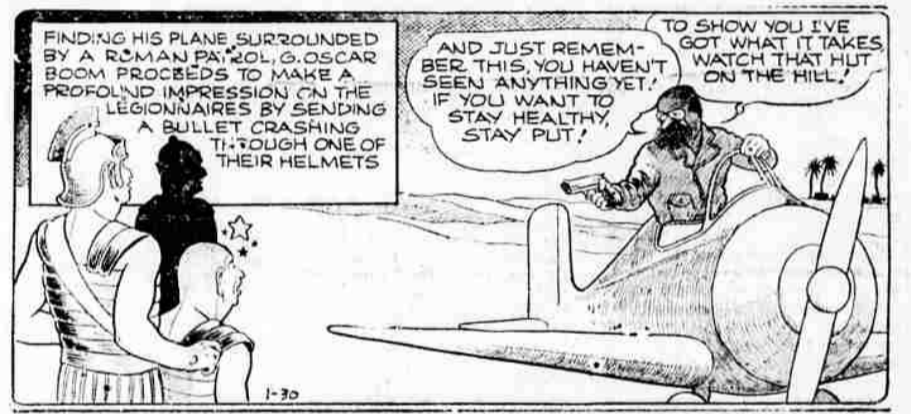

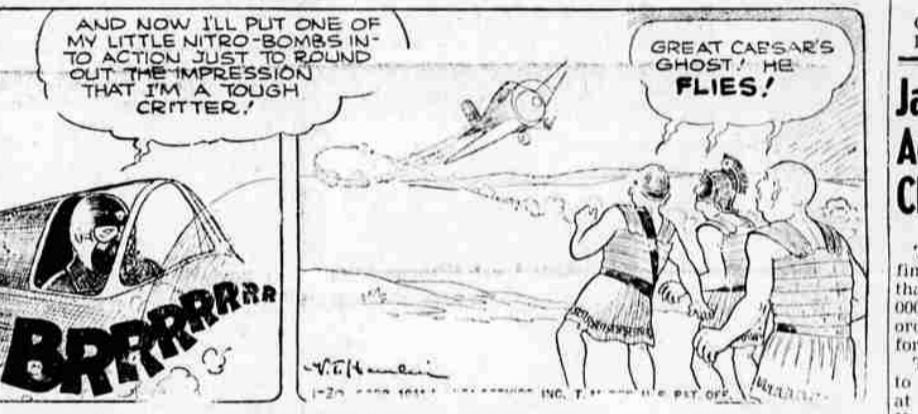

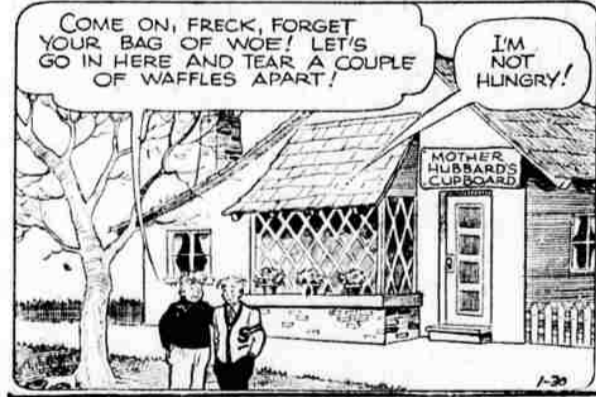

Japanese Premier Admits No Sign of Chinese Defeat

TOKYO, Jan. 28.—(AP)—The finance ministry disclosed today that Japan had spent 17,500,000,000 yen (about \$4,100,000,000) ordinary expenses of her armed forces in the "China incident." These figures were submitted to the house of representatives at a session at which Premier Konoye was represented as personally assuming full responsibility for the conflict of which he acknowledged "there is no sign of solution" despite heavy expenditures of men and money. His assumption of full responsibility was interpreted as apparently intended to mollify the fighting services, which he declared blameless for the cam-
