

Roseburg B Quint Loses to Yoncalla High Team, 31 to 24

The Roseburg B squad, playing its first game away from home this season, lost an exciting 31 to 24 basketball game to the strong Yoncalla high school team last night. The Yoncalla squad led all the way after a brief 4 to 0 Roseburg lead in the first quarter.

The first quarter was close, Yoncalla leading 9 to 8, but several shots by Bigelow and Howard gave the Eagles a 21 to 12 lead at half time. The B's rallied in the third quarter, holding the Eagles to 1 field goal, while two goals by Wimberly, one by Baker, and a pair of free throws by Tony Anderson brought Roseburg within three points at the third quarter mark. For the first three minutes of the final period, Roseburg was within one field goal of the lead, but shot after shot rolled out of the hoop, until Cox and Dodd put the game on ice for the Eagles, sinking three quick baskets in a row. Earl Howard and Glen Cox, Yoncalla mainstays under the basket, scored ten points apiece for high point honors, while Lee Wimberly had eight and Tony Anderson seven for Roseburg.

The Yoncalla volleyball team, showing some of its true championship form, easily outclassed the Reedsport team in the preliminary, 44 to 10.
