Insurance Juggler
Draws Prison Term

SEATTLE, Feb. 10.—(AP)—Hallett R. French, former insurance executive who confessed embezzling premiums on insurance he wrote on the ill-fated Tacoma narrows bridge, was sentenced to 15 years in the state penitentiary Saturday by Superior Judge Douglas.

The prominent Seattle sportsman pleaded with the court for leniency and at times his voice broke with emotion. A group of business men also appeared before the judge to ask for leniency in behalf of the 45-year-old French who pleaded guilty to embezzlement charge.

French's arrest followed the sensational collapse of the new \$6,000,000 Tacoma narrows bridge last November 7. The bridge, connecting the mainland with an arm of the Olympic peninsula, swayed and cracked up in a gale, its long roadbed falling into Puget sound.

Subsequently the Merchants Fire Assurance company of New York, of which French was general agent here, discovered that French had written \$800,000 worth of insurance on the bridge but had never reported the fact to the home office. French admitted keeping the premium money himself.

Judge Douglas refused to permit French to retain his liberty on bond or under a deferred or suspended sentence.

Charles O. Carroll, French's attorney, told the court French had returned sums to the insurance company totaling about \$17,500.

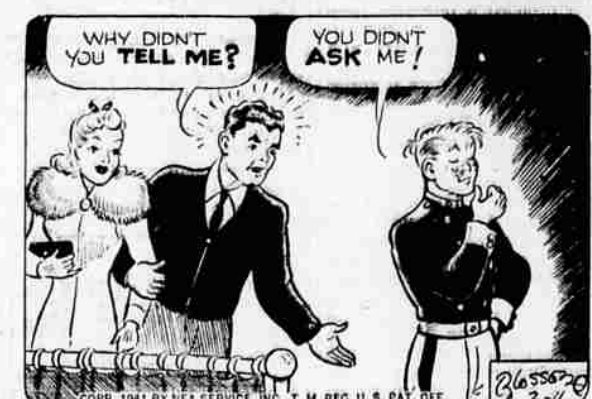
