Sealed bids will be received by the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon, up to and including March 13, 1941, for all the live and dead timber designated for cutting located on an area embracing about 602 acres within Sec. 12, T. 32 S., R. 2 W., W. M., Elk Creek watershed, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 16,000,000 feet B. M., more or less, of live Douglas-fir, 865,000 feet B. M., more or less, of dead and fire-killed Douglas-fir, 218,000 feet B. M., more or less, live and dead sugar pine, 230,000 feet B. M., more or less, of live and dead incense cedar, and 800,000 feet B. M., more or less, of live and dead hemlock and other species. No bid of less than \$1.50 per M feet for live Douglas-fir, \$.50 per M feet for dead and fire-killed Douglas-fir, \$.35 per M feet for live and dead sugar pine, \$.150 per M feet for live and dead incense cedar, \$.50 per M feet for live and dead hemlock and other species will be considered. A cooperative deposit of \$10 per M feet B. M. for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, in addition to the prices bid for the stumpage, will be required to cover the cost of slash disposal. \$2,000 must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Vic Townsend Still Tops Hoop Conference Scorers

The University of Oregon's star guard, Vic Townsend, remained at the top of the heap today in the northern division, coast conference basketball scoring race, but this week's Washington-Washington State series provides an opportunity for Paul Lindeman, state's big center, to overtake him.

Lindeman has climbed from third to second place in a week. Townsend has collected 105 points in 10 games; Lindeman, 86 points in nine games.

Washington State leads in team scoring but Oregon State has the best percentage figures in field goals and free throws. The Orangemen have dropped almost one out of every three field goal tries through the hoop for a .299 average. The Beaver average from the free throw line is .649. The Cougars of WSC, however, lead in total points. They have averaged 44.6 points per game.

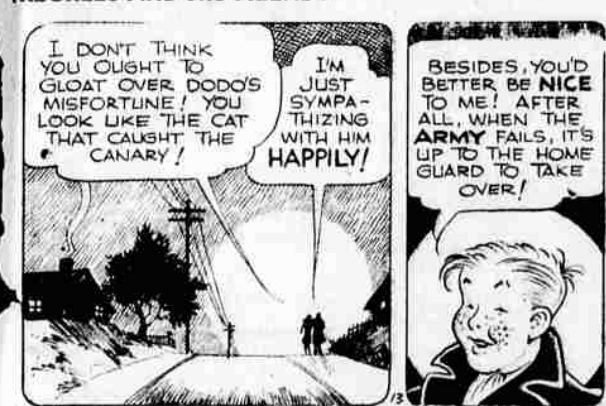

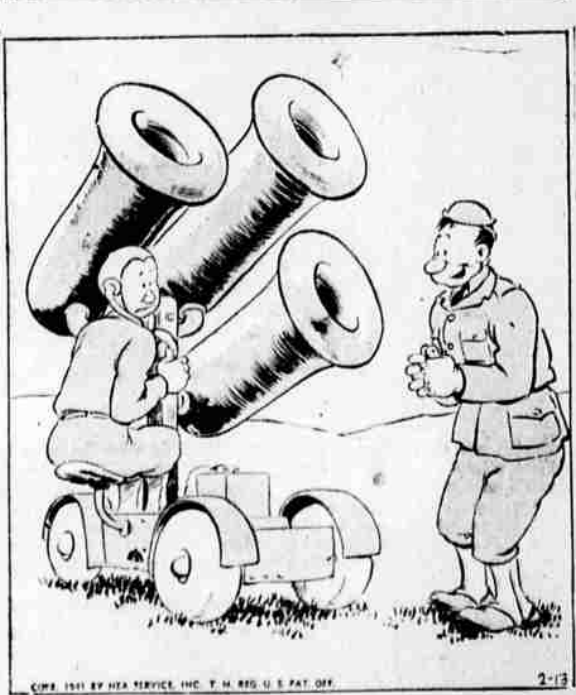
