

Morgan Grocery Will Celebrate 20th Anniversary

The 20th anniversary of the founding of Morgan's Grocery is to be celebrated this week-end by special sales events Friday and Saturday, according to Chester Morgan, proprietor.

The business was started in 1921 by D. H. Morgan, who first opened a store in the building at the corner of Sheridan and Lane streets. In September, 1927, he purchased the business operated by Pickens brothers in the Perkins building and combined the stocks of the two stores in the present location at Cass and Rose streets.

His son, Chester Morgan, became associated with the business in 1932, and in 1938 took over ownership and management upon the retirement of the founder.

Since 1932 the business has had its own delivery system, for which a new truck was purchased this week.

Proceedings to Oust Harry Bridges Started by U. S.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—(AP)—Deportation proceedings against Harry R. Bridges, west coast labor leader, were ordered by Attorney General Jackson today on the basis of an FBI report that Bridges was a communist.

The attorney general said that a warrant of arrest would be issued and served on Bridges and that hearings would be held at San Francisco beginning March 31. Bridges, head of the CIO Longshoremen's union of the Pacific coast, is an Australian.

The FBI investigation, on which a report was made to Jackson by J. Edgar Hoover, FBI director, last November declared Bridges was a communist and that the Communist party advocated overthrow of the United States government.

Committee Named For Registration Of War Veterans

Appointment of a special committee to handle the voluntary registration of all local legionnaires and world war veterans generally for possible future national defense service as part of the nationwide American Legion preparedness for any emergency was announced here today by Commander James Young of the Umpqua post, No. 16.

Commander Young has named Irvin Reigel as chairman of the special national defense registration committee. Other members of the committee are Gay Mowery, Vincent Malone and V. J. Miceli. All the officers of the local post will serve as ex-officio members of this special committee.

National Commander Milo J. Warner has fixed Saturday, February 22, the 20th anniversary of the birth of George Washington, as national defense registration day for all members of the American Legion and such unaffiliated world war veterans as may desire to participate. There is nothing compulsory about the registration. Filling out of the American Legion national defense questionnaire and rendering any service that may be called for later, both will be entirely voluntary on the part of the individual. Registration does not involve any military liability.

The nationwide registration of legionnaires and unaffiliated world war veterans was authorized by the 22nd national convention of the American Legion in Boston, Mass., last September, and subsequently by the national executive committee in Indianapolis. It is merely for the purpose of cataloging the qualifications and special talents of all legionnaires and world war veterans for national defense. From the questionnaire to be filled out by all members and veterans, local posts, department and national headquarters will prepare indexes which will list the experience, education, training and other qualifications of the registrants. The information contained in these indexes will be made available to federal, state, and local authorities whenever the need arises.

Farm Loan Assn. Units To Meet In Roseburg Feb. 15

George Leland of the Federal Land bank of Spokane will be the principal speaker when the Umpqua, Myrtle Creek and Oakland National Farm Loan associations hold their annual meeting, Saturday, February 15, Secretary-Treasurer U. D. Powell announced today. The meeting will be at the Odd Fellows hall in Roseburg and open at 10 a. m.

Mr. Leland will present a report of the operations of the Federal Land bank for 1940. The National Farm Loan associations, which make and service Federal Land bank loans in Douglas county, are stockholders in the land bank.

Reports of the business of the three associations will be made by Secretary-Treasurer Powell.

The annual report showed a total of 370 acres damaged by fire during the year, providing one of the best records ever received by the association. There were 48 fires classified as follows: Lightning 3, incendiary 20, campers 8, smokers 9, brush burning 2, logging 1, miscellaneous 5. Of the 370 acres burned over during the year, only 84 acres carried merchantable timber.
