## Cougar Hoopsters Trim Huskies, 44-42; Oregon Beats Idaho

(By the Associated Press)  
Washington State college stretched its unbroken string of northern division basketball victories to eight last night with the University of Washington as its latest victim; while Oregon, running strong after a slow start, added one more defeat to Idaho's woes.

The WSC victory at Seattle was a bare two-point affair, 44-42. Washington state was headed only once, during the first half, when Washington sent into a 13-12 advantage; but the university tied the score a half-dozen times, four of them in the last six minutes of play.

Two free throws clinched the WSC victory; and the official score disclosed that Washington's loss was chiefly due to inaccuracy. Washington took 76 shots to make 18 field goals; but WSC made the same number of goals out of only 55 shots.

At Eugene, Oregon got its fourth straight conference victory with the considerable aid of Vic Townsend, who collected 21 points personally out of the 45 Oregon ran up against Idaho's 33. The contest was generally ragged, with 30 called fouls, 18 of them against Idaho. Two players from each team went out on four personals. Oregon led, 25-16, at half time after Idaho had been in front during the early part of the game.

The two series both continue tonight, with Washington State attempting to sweep a series in the Washington pavilion for the first time in history; and Oregon striving to even its season's record against Idaho, Idaho won two games at Moscow last month.
