### National Forest Timber for Sale

Scaled bids will be received by the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon, up to and including April 11, 1941, for all the live timber marked for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 180 acres within Section 20, T. 29 S., R. 1 W., W. M., Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 1,125,000 feet B. M. more or less, of sugar pine timber, and an undetermined amount of Douglas-fir, California incense cedar, and white fir saw timber to be cut at the option of the purchaser. No bid of less than \$2.50 per M. foot for sugar pine, \$1.00 per M. foot for Douglas-fir and California incense cedar, and \$1.50 per M. foot for white fir will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$10 per M. foot B. M. for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal and a cooperative deposit of \$20 per M. foot B. M. for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and forest improvement work will be required. Bids must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon.
