Crowell Sets New Scoring Record at State Hoop Series

SALEM, March 17.—(AP)—Sammy Crowell, North Bend guard, was given his place today by state high school basketball tournament officials as one of the greatest players in tournament history, having shattered one scoring record and almost breaking another.

Scoring at will against Parkrose in the tournament's first round Wednesday, Crowell tallied 31 points to break the tournament scoring record for a single game. The old mark was 27 points, made by Ted Sarpola of Astoria against Myrtle Creek in 1936.

Crowell scored 15 points when his club was beaten in championship play by Klamath Falls, and he continued his spree Friday

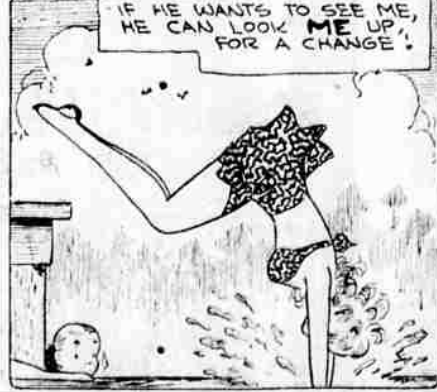

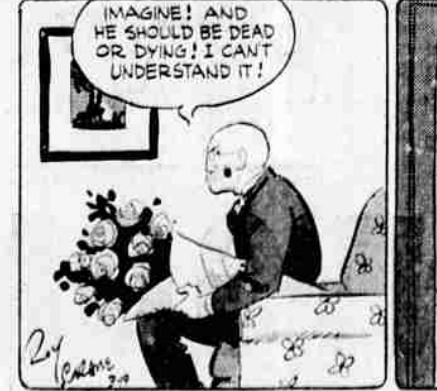
