Department StoreU. S. Prepares For
Naval Action In
Pacific Waters

BATAVIA, Netherlands East Indies, March 19.—(AP)—The United States today was reported increasing its staff of naval experts in the far east and the south Pacific.

Two officials were being stationed in Singapore, in Darwin, in Sydney, in Auckland and other points, in addition to those regularly attached to the U. S. legations in Canberra and Bangkok, it was said.

At the same time, there was great interest here in the training cruise of American warships which currently puts a total of four cruisers and nine destroyers of the U. S. navy in Australian and New Zealand waters.

Two United States cruisers and four destroyers are anchored in Auckland harbor, and two cruisers and five destroyers reached Sydney today.

Reports continued to circulate, despite any support from official quarters, that Singapore, Britain's great naval base in the Orient, would be available to the United States fleet if Japan should move southward.

At present, only the barest skeleton of a British naval squadron is stationed at Singapore. Australian air forces, however, are being increased steadily.

Similarly, the Netherlands East Indies lacks capital ships and would depend mainly upon submarines and fast torpedo boats for resistance against any naval attack.

Observers here say that, as a result, they believe the United States fleet will undertake "the heavy work" if Japan moves the main body of her capital ships against Singapore, or the East Indies, and the United States enters the conflict.

NEW YORK, March 19.—(AP)—Domei (Japanese news agency) broadcast today a press report that the Netherlands East Indies steamer Rantaupandjang, 2,542 tons, had been sunk by the German Pacific ocean raider Tokyo Maru.

The dispatch said no passengers were aboard.

The Tokyo Maru is one of three raiders credited with sinking at least six ships in the south Pacific between Dec. 6 and 8.

Consular Service
Employee Sues To
Prevent Ouster

WASHINGTON, March 19.—(AP)—Through a district court complaint filed against Secretary Hull and other state department officials, Goden H. Hammond, Jr., son of a former ambassador to Spain, sought today to block his dismissal from a career post in the foreign service.

The 29-year-old Yale alumnus declared in his petition that A. A. Berle, Jr., assistant secretary of state, had asked him to resign because of reports that he had publicly mimicked President Roosevelt and had "disloyal dealings with a female agent of a foreign government." Hammond specifically denied the truth of both reports and stated they represented a "vicious and malicious fabrication."

Hammond's petition, filed yesterday, named as defendants Hull, Berle, Assistant Secretaries Breckinridge Long, Dean Acheson, and G. Howland Shaw, and John G. Erhardt, chief of the state department's division of foreign service personnel.

Hammond served at Vienna and Leipzig, and recently has been on leave of absence from the department.

Hammond supported his petition with exhibits which included an affidavit of Lily Stein of New York that their relations in Vienna and New York were "purely platonic."
