We are tempted to give way to resentment, even hate, and to feel that the old Mosaic law is much nearer to our sense of justice than Christ's gentle admonition to turn the other cheek. We may also realize that our own lack of wisdom has contributed in large measure to the misfortune which has overtaken us, and a sense of self-condemnation is added to our already overburdened heart. Neither resentment toward another nor self-condemnation has ever yet healed any situation. Neither does the sentimental emotionalism of the old adage, "Forgive and forget," really get down to the source of the trouble. Jesus taught His disciples to pray, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." If we then are to emulate the Christ method of forgiveness we must have His spirit imparted to us that "we may love our enemies, bless them that curse us and pray for them that despitefully use us. That you may be the children of Your Father which is in heaven," Amen.

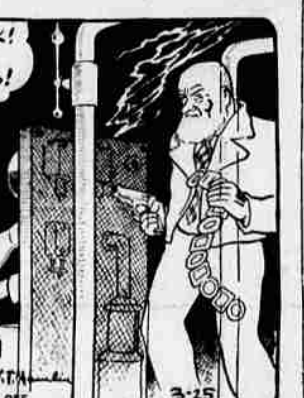

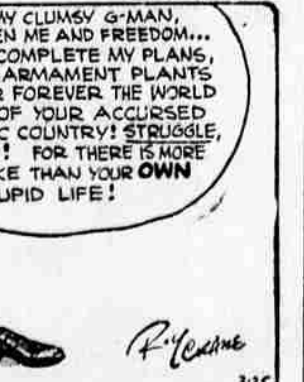
