Rep. Gile Tells Rotary Of Legislature's Work

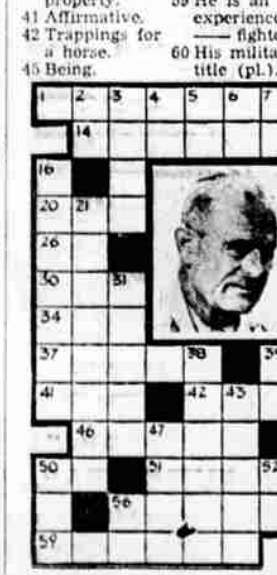
The recent session of the Oregon legislature considered more than 1000 proposals for new laws and passed a total of 511, including bills, memorials and resolutions.
