Solons Keep Half Game Lead Over Seattle Rainiers

Beavers Drop 4th Straight to Hollywood; Padres' Swatfest Defeats San Francisco

Seattle's Rainiers were still a half-game behind and still on the heels of the leading Sacramento Senators today in the Pacific coast baseball league.

Last year's champions practically gave the game away to Oakland several times last night by committing five errors, but the Aorns failed to hit in the clinches and Seattle won, 6 to 4.

Barrett, Seattle's league-leading hurler last season, retired in favor of Sylvester Johnson in the eighth but got credit for his third victory of the season against the defeat.

At Hollywood, Portland continued to dwell in the cellar when Fletcher Dasso of the Stars allowed only four hits while his teammates pounded out 13 safeties for a 3 to 2 victory. The defeat left Portland seven and a half games behind Sacramento.

The victory was Dasso's first of the season, against three defeats, but he had to score the winning run himself, to beat the Beavers in the 10th inning. It was Hollywood's fourth straight over Portland.

At Sacramento the Solons blasted Los Angeles, 12 to 3, on 17 hits off three pitchers.

At San Diego, the San Francisco Seals were routed by the Padres who also banged out 17 hits to win, 12 to 2.
